7.8 million children vaccinated against diphtheria.

4.6 million girls vaccinated against HPV

8.2 million children treated with deworming medicine.

1.2 million children under five treated for diarrhoea; nearly 300,000 for pneumonia.

1,000,000 severely wasted children received life-saving treatment.

31 million children administered two doses of vitamin A supplements.

4 million people with access to basic sanitation services through the clean Nigeria Campaign.

11 million births of children under the age of five registered.

ALL STATES developed action plans to scale-up the out-of-school model.

4 million benefactors of repair, rehabilitation, upgrading or construction of 936 water facilities.

6.2 million individuals mobilized to join the Movement for Good and work to end female genital mutilation in five states

7.2 million students enrolled in pre-primary education.

3.7 million people reached with key hygiene messages.

250,000 children with safe avenues to report sexual exploitation and abuse.

2.4 million students intake to last grade of lower secondary.

2.6 million people in 4,000 communities and 17 Local Government Areas certified as open-defecation-free.

120,000 children who experienced violence reached with integrated health, social welfare, and justice services.

2 million children accessed formal and non-formal basic education supported by UNICEF.

600,000 people in Adamawa, Borno, and Yobe states have access to safe water supply services.

17,000 adolescent girls provided with life-skills training, including comprehensive sexuality education.

780,000 users registered on the Nigeria Learning Passport.

185,000 flood-affected people received assistance in health, WASH, gender-based violence-related help and humanitarian cash transfers.

300,000+ children developed skills to improve learning outcomes.

Doubling of the National Social Registry's coverage from 15% to 30%.

Support for two social protection bills in Sokoto and Kebbi states, for the right to social protection for all children.

Comprehensive review of state-level policies, embedding context-specific measures for children.

Development of child poverty estimates and a cutting edge report providing insights into child deprivation.

Advancements in public finance for children, increasing prioritization for human capital development in Nigeria's 2024-2026 Medium-Term Expenditure framework.
